April Meeting:

- Late fees were waived for Declarant assessments.
- The board agreed to conduct a Reserve Study.
- The board agreed to start fining habitual covenant offenders.
- Five new members were added to the ACC Potter, Thompson, Young, Fortey, Fitzgerald.

Fence Standards: The board has adopted a set of standards for fences which may be found on the website. Just click on the menu item "Rules, Covenants and Standards", then scroll down the page. These standards supplement the covenants and offer a clearer set of guidelines on what will be approved by the ACC. Previously approved fences are not affected by these new guidelines.

Change in Board of Directors: Chuck Hoffman, our covenant enforcement guy a most difficult roleand Steve Anderson, our landscaping / maintenance man, have resigned. Taking Chuck's un-expired term (Nov. 2005) is Allen Alchian. James Ramsey will fill out Steve's term (Nov 2006).

Pine Beetles: Inspection of the sub-division was recently carried out and seven lots were found to have a beetle infestation. Each owner is responsible for controlling beetles on their lot. If you are concerned about beetles on lots adjacent to yours, please take it up with the owner of the affected lot or the El Paso County Forester who has the authority to enforce the law regarding this problem.

Covenant Enforcement: Since contracting with Warren Management your board has redoubled its efforts to fairly and consistently enforce the covenants. If you receive a violation letter, please take steps to cure the problem without directing your displeasure toward the management company. Owners may be cited for items that seem small but the board believes in "the broken window theory" whereby infractions need to be fixed quickly before they become "popular". It's not the mission of the board to irritate folks, but to act responsibly in order to help preserve the value of our real estate investments our homes!

Potholes: If you find'em, report'em! Call the county directly or use the KD website. Select "useful links"; scroll down to "county"; click "El Paso County Dept of Transportation"; request "report potholes".

Homeowner's Insurance Premiums : Have been in touch frequently with USAA who insures our home regarding reducing the premium since we now enjoy a better rating from the Insurance Service Organization. Our current ISO Rating is a 5-9 vs. a 9-9. I pointed this out to USAA and they dropped our premium \$324 / year. Hopefully, it will get even better when the fire department gets their "water haul" capability revaluated by ISO. If they can produce enough water to put out a house fire in a specified length of time, our rating may be reduced even further for an even greater savings. The fire department will let me know when they get the "water haul" test done and I'll advise you. In the meantime, you might talk to your insurance representative to make sure they are using the most current rating to set your premium.

- Mow your lot before July 15
- Fire season is here. Any open fire, including outside fire pits, require a permit which may be obtained from the Fire Dept. at 105 & Roller Coaster. They will also inspect your lot to insure safety requirements are met.

- Please cover your garbage containers when they're set out.
