Landscape Season

Spring will soon arrive at the Palmer Divide. This will be the chance for new home owners to get the yard landscaped, finally.

Land disturbed during the construction process should be reseeded with native grass seed to prevent erosion and reduce the encroachment of noxious weeds. The local Monument nurseries have what you need for our area. It is helpful to also purchase a few bails of straw to distribute uniformly over the seeded area to help retain moisture in the ground. With the frequent high winds in our area, you may need to re-apply the straw a time or two. However, with some watering, you will soon have the grass started. One season of watering should be all that is needed to firmly establish a ground cover that will keep most noxious weeds from taking over your yard. You shouldn't have to give it any more attention in the future, other than an occasional mowing during the summer.

For smaller areas that you intend to landscape, please remember to first have your landscape plans reviewed and approved by the King's Deer Architectural Control Committee to ensure you plans are in compliance with the covenant requirements. Send your plans, with a Miscellaneous Project application form—available on the King's Deer web site under ACC, then ACC Forms—to Warren Management Group; they will forward it to the ACC. After the ACC meets and reviews your plan, Warren Management will send you a letter explaining the results of the ACC review of your project. The ACC meeting schedule is available on the King's Deer web site under "Calendar."

There's an old saying that goes, "All improvement is a series of changes. If you refuse to change, you never improve." And to that end, the Architectural Control Committee is developing new processes and procedures that will become effective in the coming weeks.

The ACC Construction Project application, and application process, have needed an overhaul for quite some time. Your ACC committee, comprised of King's Deer volunteers, has taken on the arduous task of rewriting, clarifying, and updating the program in an effort to better protect the personal investment we all have in the King's Deer Community.

New documents and procedures will be gradually implemented over the next few weeks, with a final implementation date projected for May 1, 2006 when mandatory use of all new documents and procedures will be in effect. The new application form with instructions may be downloaded from the King's Deer web site, at ACC, Project Forms.

If you plan to submit an application for a house or detached garage, download the most current version of the application form and instructions from the web site just prior to submitting the application package. This will help you avoid unnecessary delays by ensuring you have the latest set of documents and instructions.

Overhauling the ACC program was only made possible by incorporating Warren Management Group into the processing of ACC project applications. This helps the ACC ensure that projects are constructed as approved, but there is increased expenditure to the HOA for their assistance. Therefore the Construction Project application fee will be raised to offset this additional expense.

All details of the program, as it evolves, are posted on the web site, under ACC. Review that area thoroughly prior to submitting an application for a construction project.

Recycle

Two convenient recycling centers are available in our area. A recycling container for newspapers and aluminum cans is located on the west side of the Prairie Winds Elementary school.

Also recycle newspapers and aluminum at Monument Academy Charter School, and help the school at the same time. The school is on the west side of Woodmoor Drive at the former TriLakes Rec Center (large metal building with a green roof) just south of the Lewis Palmer Middle School. The collection bins are on the north end of the parking lot.

Monument Academy Charter School will also accept computer printer ink cartridges and laser cartridges in a collection bin located at Tri-Lakes Printing (1756 Lake Woodmoor Drive). Cell phones and laptop computers are also accepted there for recycling. If you want a deductible donation receipt for a cell phone or laptop computer, include your address with the recycled item and a receipt will be mailed to you.

Vehicle Use in King's Deer

Warming temperatures invite us to spend more of our free time outside. Please remember, however, that use of vehicles of any kind within King's Deer is limited only to the public roads and your driveway. Although we have large lots in King's Deer, riding vehicles on your property other than on the driveway is prohibited. The natural vegetation is fragile because the soil is poor and the climate is dry. Once vegetation is damaged by a few runs with a dirt bike or ATV, erosion begins and the areas do not easily or quickly recover. Disrupted grounds are unsightly and the activity is annoying to neighbors. Please be considerate and confine your vehicle use to public roads.
